Associate of Arts/Applied Science to Baccalaureate Degree Articulation Agreement

Community Colleges of Spokane and Lewis-Clark State College (LC State) enter into this articulation agreement to facilitate the transfer of Community Colleges of Spokane associate degrees to LC State's baccalaureate degrees. Under the provisions of this agreement, Community Colleges of Spokane associate degree graduates will be granted admission to LC State* and will have third year (junior) standing.

*Programs such as education, nursing, and social work require additional application processes. Admission to programs with separate application processes is not guaranteed under the provisions of this agreement.

Upon completion of the Associate of Arts (AA-DTA) or Applied Associate of Science (AAS) at Community Colleges of Spokane, academic credit/courses taken at Community Colleges of Spokane will be transferred to LC State. Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA-DTA) degree will be considered core certified and, unless a specific core-level class is required for a specific baccalaureate program, will have satisfied all lower-level core requirements.

For the purposes of this agreement, a student may select any edition of the Lewis-Clark State College General Catalog, provided that the catalog was published and was in force while the student was enrolled at Community Colleges of Spokane and provided that the catalog is no older than seven (7) academic years at the time of graduation from LC State.

Provisions

• Community Colleges of Spokane will provide current AA-DTA degree requirements to LC State and notify LC State of any degree requirement changes.



- LC State agrees to offer in-person and remote/virtual information sessions and preview
 events for students. Community Colleges of Spokane agrees to promote these
 opportunities to Community Colleges of Spokane, students, faculty, and staff. For inperson events, Community Colleges of Spokane agrees to provide conference or meeting
 space at no charge to LC State.
- LC State agrees to provide Community Colleges of Spokane academic leadership and advising staff with annual updates on curriculum changes, including changes in specific program requirements.
- LC State and Community Colleges of Spokane agree to coordinate meetings between selected faculty and staff to develop, review, or update program-specific articulation agreements. The meetings will occur at least once per year.
- LC State and Community Colleges of Spokane agree to promote this articulation agreement and any program-specific articulations agreements via their web sites.

Conditions

- Students must submit an official application and provide LC State with documentation (official transcript) proving successful completion of the Associate of Arts (AA-DTA) or Applied Associate of Science (AAS) degree at Community Colleges of Spokane.
- Completion of the Associate of Arts (AA-DTA) provides a guaranteed transfer of credit to the college but does not guarantee completion of any specific department/major requirements unless identified in a program-specific agreement.
- Admission to specific areas of study/majors may be dependent upon completion of preprofessional coursework taken at Community Colleges of Spokane and possibly other considerations set forth by the specific LC State instructional division.
- If specific program/major prerequisites have not been met at Community Colleges of Spokane, those prerequisites may need to be met prior to being accepted into the program/major.
- Community Colleges of Spokane advisors may encourage students to enroll in the
 appropriate prerequisite course to satisfy associate degree requirements. Students may
 enroll in LC State classes while enrolled at Community Colleges of Spokane, subject to
 appropriate fee payment and financial aid requirements.
- Students who are enrolled in LC State classes while enrolled at Community Colleges of Spokane, and receiving federal financial aid must work with the Financial Aid offices at



both institutions. Eligibility and specific processes will depend upon how many credits a student takes at each institution.

- Students must complete a minimum total of 120 semester credits (some majors may require more) to graduate from LC State with a baccalaureate degree. A minimum of 36 semester credits must be at the upper division level (300- and 400-level courses) and 32 semester credits earned prior to graduation must be completed at LC State. Quarter credits are multiplied by two-thirds for a semester credit equivalent.
- No tuition will be assessed for transferred credit.

Renewal, Revision, Termination

This agreement is effective as of December 22, 2022 and will be reviewed for renewal every three (3) years on December 22, 2025. Either Community Colleges of Spokane or LC State upon written notice to the other institution may request revision of this agreement. Either institution, at any time during its term, may terminate the agreement for reasons of noncompliance via written notice to the other institution. Termination notice shall not be given less than 60 days prior to the end of the current term of the agreement.
