- Students who transfer without an AA/AS may need to take additional LC State General Education core courses.
- 32 Residency (LC State) credits required for graduation.
- 36 credits must be upper division.
- Students must earn a B or better in all Social Work practices courses (140, 241, 341, 342, 443, 483, 484, 485, 486)

Students must maintain a 2.7 GPA in all SW major courses and earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be awarded a BSW
