

Lewis-Clark State College/College of Western Idaho Associate of Arts/Science to Baccalaureate Degree Articulation Agreement

The College of Western Idaho (CWI) and Lewis-Clark State College (LCSC) enter into this articulation agreement to facilitate the transfer of the College of Western Idaho's AA/AS degrees to Lewis-Clark State College's baccalaureate degrees. Under the provisions of this agreement, CWI students may be granted admission into LCSC* with third year (junior) standing, conditional on having met the conditions contained within this agreement.

*Programs such as education, nursing, and social work require additional application processes. Admission to these programs is not guaranteed.

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this agreement is to articulate the College of Western Idaho Associate of Arts (AA) and Associate of Science (AS) degrees with Lewis-Clark State College baccalaureate degrees.

Upon completion of the AA or AS degree at the College of Western Idaho, academic credit/courses taken at College of Western Idaho will be transferred to Lewis-Clark State College and LC will consider the student core certified. This agreement is intended to address the transfer of the AA/AS degree and only applies only to those students who have completed and earned the AA/AS degree.

For the purposes of this agreement, the student may select any edition of the Lewis-Clark State College catalog, provided that the catalog was published and was in force while the student was enrolled at Lewis-Clark State College and/or the College of Western Idaho, and provided that the catalog is no older than six (6) academic years at the time of graduation from Lewis-Clark State College.

Process

- College of Western Idaho will provide current AA/AS degree requirements to Lewis-Clark State College and notify LC of any degree requirement changes.
- College of Western Idaho will provide advisement to College of Western Idaho students throughout their attendance at CWI. Lewis-Clark State College will provide pre-transfer advising at the point the student attains 45 credits.

- Lewis-Clark State College staff will be available for questions and assistance related to transfer issues along with periodic training opportunities for College of Western Idaho advisors.
- Lewis-Clark State College will notify College of Western Idaho of any degree requirement changes.
- Lewis-Clark State College will provide College of Western Idaho advisors and students
 with specific department/major pre-professional course requirements including course
 equivalency worksheets along with other, if applicable, department/major specific
 requirements.

Conditions

- Students must submit an official application to Lewis-Clark State College and provide
 LC with documentation (transcripts) proving successful completion of the AA/AS degree
 at College of Western Idaho.
- Completion of the AA/AS degree provides a guarantee transfer of credit to the university but does not guarantee completion of any specific department/major requirements.
- Admission to specific areas of study/majors may be dependent upon completion of preprofessional coursework taken at College of Western Idaho and possibly other considerations set forth by the specific Lewis-Clark State College division.
- If specific prerequisites have not been met at College of Western Idaho, those
 prerequisites will need to be met prior to being accepted into the program/major.
- Attendance at another institution after completion of their College of Western Idaho degree and prior to start at Lewis-Clark State College will void the provisions of this agreement.
- Students must complete a minimum total 120 credits to graduate from Lewis-Clark State
 College with a bachelor degree. A minimum of 40 credits must be at the upper division
 level and 30 of the last 36 credits for graduation must be completed at Lewis-Clark State
 College.
- No tuition will be assessed for articulated credit.
- Non completion of the College of Western Idaho AA/AS degree program will void the
 provisions of this agreement. Students seeking admission to Lewis-Clark State College
 without the AA/AS degree may not benefit from the provisions of this agreement and
 should contact the Lewis-Clark State College admissions office for regular admissions
 requirements.

Renewal, Revision, Termination

This agreement is effective as of February 1, 2018, and will be reviewed for renewal every five (5) years. Either CWI or LCSC upon written notice to the other institution may request revision

of this agreement. Either institution, at any time during its term, may terminate the agreement for reasons of noncompliance via written notice to the other institution. Termination notice shall not be given less than 60 days prior to the end of the current term of the agreement.
