• Completion of a degree in Secondary Education Kinesiology leads to a State of Idaho Standard Instructional teaching certificate with endorsements in Physical Education K-12 and Health 6-12.

• The LCSC teacher education program is nationally accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) and state-accredited by the Idaho State Department of Education. Because the State of Idaho is a member of the NASDTEC interstate agreement, your Idaho teaching credential will be accepted by other states that are also members of NASDTEC. Conditions uniquely applicable to a specific state's certification may apply (e.g. additional testing, coursework, etc.). At WWCC a minimum grade of "C-" is required for Gen Ed courses and a minimum 2.0 GPA is required to qualify for Associate's Degree.

LCSC teacher education program requires a minimum cumulative 3.0 gpa and a minimum 3.0 gpa in the content area.
