


The Todd J. Kilburn Arbor Day Walk

This tree is part of Presidents' Row, commemorating the work of President Cleon Caldwell, who served LCSC from 1957 to 1963, a time in which I was born. Like most dogwood trees, this beautiful specimen provides beautiful, colorful flowers each spring.

The tallest tree on the whole campus! This tree is a majestic statement when you observe the size of its trunk and the expansiveness of its branches. It brings an elegance as it towers above a place where generations of students have walked.

These bloom in beautiful pink and white, bringing life to the main quad. Cherries surround the Admin Building and RCH, creating a floral frame. A smaller specimen resides on President's row; this tree commemorates LCSC President Dr. Jerold Duggar (1968-1978).
