Student Enrollment, Engagement, and Success	\$ 110.75	<p>Student Work Scholarship-The fee is used to fund the institutional work-study program. Departments and students are awarded/allocated these funds for employment on campus.</p> <p>Scholarships-The scholarship fee funds scholarships for students.</p> <p>Student Media-These fees fund all aspects of the operation of the student newspaper (The Pathfinder), the operations of the LCSC student run radio station which is broadcast to the local LC Valley on 88.9 FM and streams globally through www.klcz.com, and the continuing operation of the nationally recognized creative writing journal "The Talking River Review."</p> <p>"The Talking River Review" is run completely by students in our English: Publishing Arts major, the Talking River Review student club, and by students enrolled in our ENGL 215 "Internship in Publishing" course. The students accept submissions, judge them, decide what to publish, market and sell the journal, do promotions, layout design, edit, manage the budget, and take care of every other aspect of running a major literary journal. The publication is partly maintained by subscriptions that are sold to libraries, universities, and individuals.</p> <p>Student Programming, Warrior Entertainment Board (WEB)-Funds social/co-curricular activities, cultural events, performances, lectures, keynote addresses and collaborative programming by and for students. The Entertainment Board employs up to 5 students per year and provides other interested students with the opportunity to gain practical experience in event management and promotion.</p> <p>Institutional Development-This fee is used to help cover expenses for students to attend professional conferences related to their academic major or to fund participation in academic competitions.</p> <p>Silverthorne Series-Supports visiting artistic and cultural performances and films for students, in partnership with the community.</p> <p>Drama / Theatre-This fee funds all of the costs associated with our yearly productions. At least one show each semester is offered. The fees help pay licensing fees, props, costumes, lighting/sound, consulting, and other production costs. LCSC students are admitted to all productions for free. Fees also help subsidize costs for Theatre student trips to the Oregon Shakespeare Festival and the Kennedy Center American Collegiate Theatre Festival each year.</p> <p>Music-This fee funds the activities of the LCSC Choir and the LCSC Jazz Band. Both of these groups rehearse weekly during the year and put on at least one or two concerts per semester. Examples of costs include: music licensing fees, instrument repair and maintenance, venue rental, lighting/sound for performances, printing of programs & sheet music, advertising / promotion, and technical expertise and consulting. All students are admitted for free to performances.</p> <p>Center for Arts & History-Supports campus and student art exhibits. Also funds scholarship for students to participate in visiting artist workshops and classes.</p> <p>Alumni Association-Funds programs administered by the Office of Alumni Relations that focus on students and recent graduates. Examples include: Student Alumni Committee (SAC), Family Weekend, AMP (Alumni Mentor Program), Homecoming, Warrior Welcome events (Lewiston and Coeur d'Alene), Senior Send Off (Lewiston and Coeur d'Alene), Warrior4Life Wednesday Events, Dinner with Warriors, sponsorship of student activities and events, partnerships with New Student Recruitment, International Programs, and Native American & Minority Services.</p>
Student Health and Wellness	\$ 82.00	<p>Student Health Center-Provides funding for Student Health Services, support and funding for counseling and support staff and various health prevention and education efforts to comply with applicable laws and regulations.</p> <p>Residence Hall Operations-Capital improvements, building projects, and debt service for student housing expansion and renovation projects.</p>
Institutional Operations, Services, and Support	\$ 169.75	<p>ID Card-Funding provides students with an ID card that allows access to various activities, venues, meal plans and Warriorbucks, as well as identification as an LCSC student.</p> <p>Student Union Building Operations-Revenue from this fee pays for maintenance and personnel for the Student Union Building, a building designed for use by students.</p> <p>Athletics-The Athletics Fee supports sports programs offered on the LCSC campus. The fee provides access to students and their families to regular season athletics contests.</p> <p>Daycare/KinderCollege-The student fee is used to provide support for the childcare center and offset a discounted student rate of \$100 per month for full time LCSC students who have their children enrolled in child care at the KinderCollege.</p> <p>Outdoor Recreation-Funds the operation and maintenance of Outdoor Recreation to include outdoor trips (Outdoor Adventures) and rental center (Float 'N' Tote).</p> <p>Fitness Center-Supports the maintenance and operation of the Fitness Center facility.</p> <p>Intramurals-Fund used to manage all aspects of Intramurals to include leagues, tournaments, special events and sports clubs.</p> <p>Sales Tax</p>
Student Government	\$ 53.00	<p>Student Activities-Supports student events such as the annual Welcome Fairs, where students may engage with representatives from student services, instructional programs, student organizations, and regional businesses who offer services to college students. This fee also supports student entertainment and leadership programming.</p> <p>Associated Student Body**-Funds the Associated Students of LCSC (student government), responsible for representing student concerns and interests to the greater campus community and facilitating student engagement, primarily by funding student events (e.g., graduation awards programs) and assisting other student organizations with special projects. ASLCS allocates a portion of its budget each year to assist with student club startup funds or fundraising matches. ASLCS employs 11 students per year.</p> <p>**Students will be able to opt-out of the \$3 Student Clubs and Organizations component of the Student Government fee.</p>

Facility	\$ 94.50	This fee funds repairs and upgrades to LCSC property, provides more student housing options, and assures that LCSC spaces comply with applicable laws and regulations. Starting in the Fall 2019, a portion of this fee also provides funds for future planning and development of a general use facility (e.g. a recreation/wellness center).
Technology	\$ 75.00	The technology fee pays for student laser printing. The tech fee also pays for the annual cost of major systems used to recruit and admit students, communicate with students, pay bills, enroll in classes, record grades, and provide transcripts.
